What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by local English-speaking guides or driver-guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.
- Transportation: roads in the islands can be winding and bumpy. Vehicles used (coasters, minibuses, minivans) have generally small seats and limited space and legroom.
- Guests will be required to sign a liability waiver to participate in some activities.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked on board, using the booking forms (sign-up lists) available at the Excursion Desk.
- The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- Transfers and debark tours ending at the airport can also be pre-paid prior to your cruise.
- In order to provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the tour are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. **However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes.** The latest updated tour descriptions are available on board the ship in a file at the Excursion Desk and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

TOBAGO (Charlotteville) - Angel Reef snorkelling adventure

Begin your excursion with a short tender ride from the ship to the quaint pier in Charlotteville, where you'll board a minibus for a scenic 30-minute drive through Tobago's lush, mountainous interior en route to Speyside, on the north-east coast. Upon arrival at the Speyside beach jetty, you'll board a glass-bottom boat and cruise along the island's stunning emerald coastline before heading out to Angel Reef - a world-renowned snorkeling and diving destination. Known for its crystal-clear waters with visibility up to 100 feet, Angel Reef offers a spectacular underwater experience. As you glide across the water, your guide will highlight local points of interest and share insights into the reef's vibrant marine ecosystem. Drift over ancient coral formations, giant sea sponges, and schools of colorful reef fish thriving in their natural habitat. Once anchored, you'll have the opportunity to snorkel, swim, or simply relax on board and take in the beauty of this Caribbean paradise. After your aquatic adventure, return to Speyside beach to rejoin your minibus for the return drive to Charlotteville and tender back to your ship.

- ✓ This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or for pregnant women.
- ✓ The itinerary and sequence of activities may vary depending on sea/weather conditions, at the captain's discretion.
- ✓ Snorkeling is only recommended for experienced swimmers.

TOBAGO (Charlotteville) - Argyle Waterfalls trail

Embark on a scenic half-day adventure through Tobago's lush rainforest, with a visit to the breathtaking Argyle Waterfalls. Your journey begins with a 45-minute drive along the island's picturesque Windward Coast to the town of Roxborough, where you'll enter the Tobago Main Ridge Forest Reserve - the oldest legally protected forest reserve in the Western Hemisphere and a UNESCO-recognized site of ecological significance.

Upon arrival, join a naturalist guide for a moderate 30-minute hike (each way) along a forest trail rich in tropical flora and fauna. Your destination is the stunning Argyle Waterfall, a serene three-tiered cascade set in the heart of the reserve. Enjoy approximately one hour at the falls, where you may swim in the natural pool, explore the area, or simply relax and take in the peaceful surroundings. After your rainforest and waterfall experience, return to the visitor center and board your minibus for the scenic drive back to Charlotteville.

Please note:

- ✓ Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up; bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, a towel from the ship and water.
- ✓ Minimum age to participate is 8 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult).
- ✓ The trail and area around the waterfall are uneven and can be slippery, especially after rain. Sturdy footwear is recommended.
- ✓ Walking time is approx. 1 hour (30 min each way), on uneven and dirty ground with inclines.
- ✓ Guests will spend approximately 1 hour at the waterfall. Swimming is optional. The water may not always be crystal clear - particularly after rain.
- ✓ The minibus journey between the port and the visitor center takes approx. 45 min. Roads in Tobago are winding and may be bumpy in places.

Embark on a half-day cultural and ecological journey into Tobago's lush rainforest and rich agricultural heritage. Departing from Castara bay, enjoy a scenic drive along the island's Windward Coast, then ascend into the Tobago Main Ridge Forest Reserve to reach Roxborough, on the south coast.

Your destination is the renowned Tobago Cocoa Estate, celebrated for producing world-class, high-quality cocoa used in fine chocolate products. Upon arrival, you'll be welcomed by a member of the estate's management team, who will guide you through the cocoa production process.

Enjoy a guided walk through the plantation, where you'll see cocoa trees up close and learn how the pods are harvested, fermented, sun-dried, and bagged for the export market. This immersive experience offers valuable insight into one of Tobago's most treasured agricultural traditions.

After the tour, you'll be treated to a tasting session featuring freshly brewed cocoa tea and samples of Tobago's artisan chocolate bars, giving you a literal taste of the island's chocolate-making excellence.

On your return journey, stop briefly at the Speyside Lookout for panoramic views of the coast, and visit the historic Speyside Waterwheel before heading back to the ship.

- ✓ Dress for the weather and wear comfortable walking shoes; bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.

Depart the charming fishing village of Castara, located on Tobago's picturesque northwestern coast, on a 4x4 adventure through some of the island's most scenic and rugged landscapes. Climb into the Northside Hills, on the edge of the protected Main Ridge Rainforest, the oldest legally protected rainforest in the Western Hemisphere.

Along the way, enjoy panoramic views of the Caribbean Sea before descending into the secluded valley of King Peter's Bay. This remote black-sand beach offers an unspoiled natural setting, where weather and sea conditions may permit opportunities for snorkeling or swimming.

On the return journey to Castara, pause at a scenic lookout overlooking Castara Bay, where you can take in sweeping views of the coastline and your ship before concluding your tour.

- ✓ Minimum age to participate is 12 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult).

Relish the secluded beauty of Anse La Roche, one of Carriacou's most secluded and picturesque beaches, which is mainly accessible by boat.

Set sail for the uninhabited cays of the south on an afternoon dedicated to the Caribbean's most beloved marine creatures: sea turtles. This expedition will take you to the pristine waters of Saline and White Islands, renowned for their crystal-clear visibility and tranquil atmosphere.

Take a dip in the calm, protected waters of Saline Island, a natural sanctuary where sea turtles can often be spotted grazing on seagrass and swimming through coral reefs.

Then relax on the dazzling white sands of White Island, a tiny tropical gem. The surrounding waters offer a peaceful snorkeling experience in a truly 'unspoilt' setting.

Please note:

- ✓ ***A wet landing is required at Carriacou!***
- ✓ This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or for pregnant women.
- ✓ Guests must know how to swim. Minimum age to participate is 10 years.

TOBAGO CAYS - Time at leisure at the beach (no shore excursions organized)

Tobago Cays are one of the most pristine and idyllic treasures of the Caribbean, located in the Grenadines Islands. This archipelago consists of five small uninhabited islands surrounded by a vast coral reef that offer white sand beaches, clear turquoise waters and palms. Visitors are drawn to the crystal-clear, vibrant blue waters, the immaculate white sandy beaches, and the exceptional marine life. The Tobago Cays are a dream destination for nature lovers, divers, and sailors, who come to enjoy the peaceful atmosphere and the unspoiled natural environment.

Tobago Cays is officially a National Park since 1997.

The ship will be at anchor and there will be continuous tender service to the beach at Petit Bateau Island (wet landing). Once ashore, you will immediately find yourself in a paradise-like setting where you can enjoy activities such as snorkeling, swimming, or simply relaxing on the beaches.

Rising to 880 ft (268 m), Mount Royal rewards your effort with spectacular 360° panoramic views over both the northern and southern Grenadines. At the summit, take a moment to pause, breathe, and enjoy the unforgettable scenery unfolding beneath you.

Continue northeast to Spring Bay, a shallow cove at the foot of a majestic coconut grove with trees reaching over 100 feet tall. This fertile valley was once a thriving sugar plantation, and the nearby ruins of the Spring Sugar Factory now house the charming Firefly Hotel on an historic estate.

Your journey continues through Industry, where you'll take in the island's beautiful landscape before heading to the famous lookout at Mount Pleasant. Return to the harbor and soak in the tranquility of this stunning island before boarding your vessel.

Embark on a scenic drive along Martinique’s picturesque northern coastline to the peaceful village of Le Prêcheur, located at the island’s northern tip. Enjoy stunning views of the sea and lush, tropical landscapes along the way.

Your first stop is Habitation Céron, a meticulously restored 17th-century sugar estate nestled on the northwestern slopes of Mount Pelée, a UNESCO-recognized biodiversity hotspot. This historic site offers a unique blend of heritage and nature. Wander through its beautifully landscaped tropical gardens, and encounter the majestic Zamana Tree—a 19th-century giant that dominates the 5,000m² park with its awe-inspiring presence. The peaceful surroundings provide a moment to reflect on Martinique’s rich history and vibrant ecosystem.

Continue to the Depaz Distillery, where you’ll delve into the traditional methods of crafting rum agricole, Martinique’s signature spirit. Unlike most rums made from molasses, rum agricole is distilled from fresh sugar cane juice and protected under the Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée (AOC), a French certification of authenticity and quality. Learn about the distilling process and the importance of Martinique’s unique terroir—its volcanic soil, tropical climate, and ancestral techniques. You’ll also have the opportunity to sample a selection of the distillery’s acclaimed rums while enjoying the tranquil gardens that surround the estate. After this enriching experience, return to your ship with a deeper understanding of Martinique’s cultural heritage, natural beauty, and exceptional rum-making traditions.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves approximately 2 hours of walking over uneven surfaces, including inclines and steps.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.
- ✓ Estimated driving times: 35 min from Saint-Pierre to Habitation Céron; 35 min from Habitation Céron to Depaz Distillery; 15 min from the distillery back to Saint-Pierre. The order of site visits may vary.

MARTINIQUE (Saint-Pierre) – A stroll through Saint Pierre

Get ready for a guided tour of Saint-Pierre, a town rich in history and culture that offers a unique insight into Martinique’s past. Known as the “Little Paris of the Antilles,” Saint-Pierre was once the island’s financial and cultural capital, thriving on the sugar and rum trade. Its prosperity came to a tragic end in 1902, when the dormant volcano of Mount Pelée erupted violently. A devastating pyroclastic flow destroyed the town within minutes and claimed nearly 30,000 lives, making it one of the deadliest natural disasters of the 20th century.

Rebuilt from the 1920s onwards, Saint-Pierre never regained its former importance after the capital moved to Fort-de-France. Today, its ruins and restored monuments bear witness to both its glorious past and tragic history.

Your visit begins at Place Bertin, in the heart of Saint-Pierre, where your guide will bring the town’s history to life. As you stroll through the historic streets, you will hear stories about the town’s golden age and the dramatic events of 1902. You will discover the ruins of the Merchant’s House, visit the prison cell of Cyparis - the famous survivor of the eruption - and explore streets where every corner tells a story.

The tour also includes the restored cathedral, the Franck Perret Museum dedicated to the eruption of Mount Pelée, and the remains of the old theatre, once a symbol of the city’s cultural splendour.

A memorable experience not to be missed while visiting Martinique.

Drive through the historic town of Soufrière, passing the town square and Cathedral, and arrive at Sulphur Springs Park - home to the Caribbean's only drive-in volcano. The road leads directly into the remnants of a volcanic crater, a dramatic moonscape of barren earth and gravel where pools of muddy water bubble and clouds of steam rise with the distinctive scent of sulphur.

Stroll through the lush botanical garden, admire tropical plants lining the path, and enjoy the beauty of the cascading waterfall before reboarding the bus.

After a short drive, arrive at a charming hillside restaurant offering panoramic views of the iconic Pitons - St. Lucia's famous twin peaks rising dramatically from Soufrière Bay.

Have your camera ready for a perfect photo opportunity while enjoying a complimentary glass of local rum punch or fruit juice on the verandah. The tour concludes with a short drive back down to the port.

EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Active (sport):** Very good physical condition, stamina and skill are required. Passengers should be fit and active to participate in tours involving hiking, kayaking, snorkeling, cycling or similar activities.
